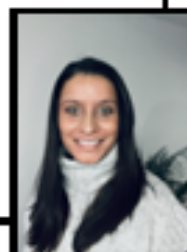

We have also loved sharing all your child's learning with you at our parent meetings. We hope you have found them useful.

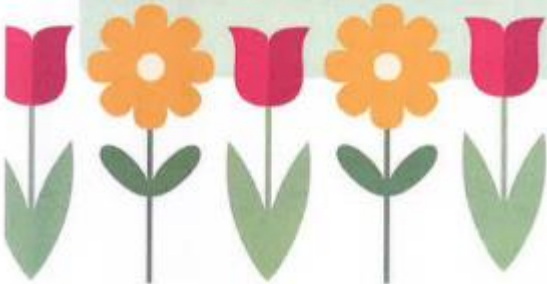
We have also seen some wonderful costumes on world book day and enjoyed making crafts for special events such as Easter, Pancake day and Mother's Day.

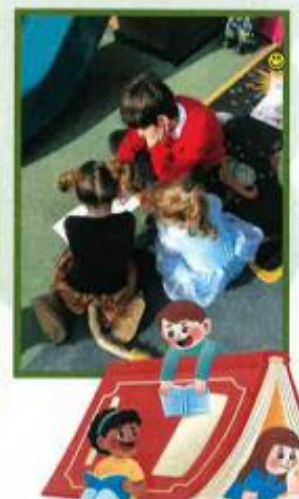
