Music - How Does Music help us to understand our Neighbours?

This Unit of Work celebrates a wide range of musical styles. The clearly sequenced lessons support the key areas of the English Model Music Curriculum; Listening, Singing, Playing Composing and Performing. There are options for assessment, deeper learning and further musical exploration.

History - 'What was it like when our Grandparents were Children?'

In this unit, the children will:

- develop an awareness of the past
- use common words and phrases relating to the passing of time
- identify similarities and differences between ways of life in different periods.

The children will use some common words and phrases related to the passage of time, such as nowadays, in the past, and previously

- identify a range of similarities and differences between their own lives and those of their grandparents as children
- use sources of evidence to draw their own conclusions about the past.

Science - Seasonal Changes

- Gather and record data to help in answering questions.
- To observe changes across the four seasons
- To observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.

Physical Education - Team Building and Sending & Receiving

As in all units, pupils develop physical, social, emotional and thinking whole child objectives.

In this unit pupils develop their communication and problem-solving skills. They work individually, in pairs and in small groups, learning to take turns, work collaboratively and lead each other.

Pupils will develop their sending and receiving skills including throwing and catching, rolling, kicking, tracking and stopping a ball. Pupils will be given opportunities to work with a range of different sized balls. They will apply their skills individually, in pairs and in small groups and begin to organise and self-manage their own activities. They will understand the importance of abiding by the rules to keep themselves and others safe.

Religious Education - 'Stories of Jesus'

Theme: Easter - Palm Sunday

Key Question: Why was Jesus welcomed like a king or celebrity by the crowds on Palm Sunday?

Religion: Christianity (Concept: Salvation)

Art - Take One Artist -
